

Exporting References from a ProQuest Database to Endnote

1. Conduct your search

2. Check the box for each of the references to be exported to EndNote. (More than one article can be selected at a time) Click on "Export/Save" and choose "Endnote, Reference Manager, or ProCite".


3. Click "Continue"




4. The first time you try to download a reference, your browser may prevent the pop-up window from opening. If this happens, choose to allow popups and then redo the same steps you followed before to export the article.




5. Firefox users will need to select the default "Open With" option and then select "EndNote" from the dropdown menu. Click "OK"



6. EndNote will automatically open with the exported references in your “Imported” and “All References” sections of your EndNote library



7. Choose each reference, click on the reference tab, and review the information to make sure it is correct.
